Mohd A. RuJoub is a professor of accounting at Eastern Connecticut State University. He holds a Ph.D. in accounting from University of Arkansas. His academic career includes teaching posts at St. John's University, University of North Carolina System-Elizabeth City Camps, and the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (UI). In addition, he was a visiting scholar at University of Illinois's Center for International Research and Education in Accounting (CIREA). RuJoub's teaching interests include accounting information technology and business solutions, accounting systems, management accounting, financial accounting and accounting theory, and governmental accounting.

RuJoub has published scholarly work in the areas of financial accounting, accounting systems, and international accounting in the *Journal of Managerial Issues*, *The Leading Edge in Research* and in conference proceedings of the American Accounting Association. He is co-author of "Accounting and Financial Reporting for Governmental Units and Not-For-Profit Organizations", 3rd Edition, Published by Kendall/Hunt Publishing Co. He also served as *ad hoc* reviewer for numerous accounting publications and professional and academic programs over the years.

RuJoub was the recipient of the South Carolina Governor's Distinguished Professor of the Year for 1998/1999 and the Henry McBay research fellowship sponsored by the College Fund/UNCF. He was a nominee for the 1997/1998 Tenneco Teaching Excellence Award.

RuJoub is currently serving as (a) the Coordinator of the Accounting program at Eastern, (b) Sam Walton Foundation fellow, and (c) mentor for Students in Free Enterprise (SIFE) organization, Eastern Accounting Society and the Eastern IMA Student Chapter. He served as Nissan Corporation, USA, fellow for 1998.

RuJoub is a member of the American Accounting Association (AAA), KPMG IFRS Institute, CFO Association, National Beta Gamma Sigma Honorary Society, The Academy of Accounting Historians, and the Institute of Management Accountants (IMA).
